## The U.S. Department of Agriculture Provides Project Plan Revision Guidance for REAP, NewERA, and PACE Programs

On March 26, 2025, the U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) announced that previously obligated funding under the Rural Energy For America Program (REAP), Empowering Rural America (New ERA) and Powering Affordable Clean Energy (PACE) programs would be released. The guidance instructs recipients to review and voluntarily revise project plans to align with the current administration's priorities within 30 days. # <u>Michigan Department of Environment, Great Lakes, and Energy Agriculture and Rural Businesses Energy Incentive Program Open for Applications</u>

EGLE is offering matching grants of up to \$50,000 to accelerate the implementation of energy efficiency and renewable energy on farms, agriculture-related entities, and rural business through the Agriculture and Rural Businesses Energy Incentive Program. This grant opportunity will support increased resilience and stability of agricultural, agriculture-related, and rural businesses in Michigan through energy efficiency, renewable energy, electrification, and other innovative projects. # Rhode Island Office of Energy Resources Agricultural Energy Grant Program Open for Applications

The Rhode Island Office of Energy Resources and Rhode Island Department of Environmental Management are accepting applications for the Spring 2025 round of the Agricultural Energy Program, which provides grants of up to \$20,000 for eligible energy efficiency and renewable energy projects on farms across the state. ## Idaho Governor's Office of Energy and Mineral Resources Accepting Applications for Government Leading by Example Program

The Idaho Office of Energy and Mineral Resources (OEMR) is accepting applications from rural cities and counties that want to save energy in existing public buildings. Approved applicants will receive a building energy audit which will identify energy saving opportunities and may qualify for some cost-share funding on energy efficient retrofits. #### Oregon Industrial Symbiosis Study Tour

In June 2024, the Center for Sustainable Infrastructure and Business Oregon organized a study tour in Denmark for a delegation of Oregon businesses to explore the potential of industrial symbiosis, or innovative circular economy models for turning energy and resource waste byproducts into

## 2.4 GW Sunstone Solar Facility Approved for Construction in Oregon, Tariff to Support Local Agriculture

The largest proposed solar and storage project to date in the U.S. was approved by the Oregon Energy Facility Siting Council, the 2.4-gigawatt Sunstone Solar facility in eastern Oregon with Pine Gate Renewables as the primary developer. The project consists of a 1,200-megawatt solar farm paired with 7,200 megawatt hours of energy storage. This project pledges \$1,000 per project acre in contributions to a county-managed fund that will support local agriculture and to take steps that will meet viewshed, wildlife, historical, and land use preservation standards. This is the third Oregon-based project to propose a financial offset for project siting impacts, along with the Oregon Trail Solar and Wagon Trail Solar projects.
